It didn't take long for Manuel García Murillo, a**bricklayer** who took over as m ayor here last June, to realize that his town was in trouble. It was800,000 eur os, a little more than \$1 million, in thered. There was no cash on hand to pay for anything — and there was work that needed to bedone.

But then an amazing thing happened, he said. Just as the health department was about toclose down the day care center because it didn't have a proper **k itchen**, Bernardo Benítez, a**construction** worker, offered to put up the walls and the tiles free. Then, Maria José Carmona, an adult education teacher, ste pped in to clean the place up.

And somehow, the volunteers just kept coming. Every Sunday now, the resid ents of this townin southwest Spain — young and old —

do what needs to be done, whether it is cleaning thestreets, raking the leave s, unclogging culverts or planting trees in the park.

"It was an **initiative** from them," said Mr. García.

"Day to day we talked to people and we toldthem there was no money. Of co urse, they could see it. The grass in between the sidewalks wasup to my thig h."

Higuera de la Serena is in many ways a microcosm of Spain's troubles. Just a s Spain's nationaland regional governments are struggling with the **collapse** of the **construction** industry, overspending on huge capital projects and a pil eup of unpaid bills, the same problems **afflict**many of its small towns.

But what has brought Higuera de la Serena a **measure** of fame in Spain is th at the residentshave stepped up where their government has failed. Mr. Garcí a says his phone rings regularlyfrom other town officials who want to know h ow to do the same thing. He is serving withoutpay, as are the town's two oth er elected officials. They are also forgoing the cars and phonesthat usually co me with the job.

"We lived beyond our means," Mr. García said.

"We invested in public works that weren'tsensible. We are in technical ban kruptcy." Even some money from the European Union thatwas supposed to be used for routine operating expenses and last until 2013 has already been spent, he said.

Higuera de la Serena, a cluster of about 900 houses surrounded by farmland, and traditionally**dependent** on pig farming and olives, got swept up in the g iddy days of the **constructionboom**. It built a cultural center and invested i

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n a small nursing home. But the projects wereplagued by delays and cost ove rruns.

The cultural center still has no bathrooms. The nursing home, a whitewashed building sits onthe edge of town, still unopened. Together, they account for s ome \$470,000 of debt owed tothe bank. But the rest of the debt is mostly th e unpaid bills of a town that was not keeping upwith its expenses. It owes for medical supplies, for diesel fuel, for road repair, for electricalwork, for musici ans who played during holidays.

Higuera de la Serena is not completely without workers. It still has a halftime librarian, two half-time street cleaners, someone part-

time for the sports **complex**, a secretary and an**administrator**, all of whom are paid through various **financing** streams apart from the town.But the tow n once had a work force twice the size. And when someone is ill, volunteers h ave tostep in or the gym and sports **complex** — open four hours a day — must close.

他说 接下来居然发生一件让人意想不到的事情 那时由于没有一个像样儿的厨房 卫生部正准备关闭托儿所 一名叫做伯纳多·贝尼特斯的建筑工人提出为其免费修筑墙壁并贴上瓷砖 一名叫做玛丽亚·何塞·卡莫纳的成人教师也站了出来 要帮助打扫托儿所

不知怎么地 志愿者们一个个接踵而至 现在 每逢周日 这座西班牙西南部小镇的居民们 无论老少 都来帮助完成镇里那些需要被完成的事宜 有人清扫大街 有人清理落叶 有人疏

加西亚说道 "他们都是自愿的 我们日复一日地和人民进行交谈 并告诉他们镇里还没有钱 当然 他们能看得出来 因为人行道两侧的草都长到我大腿那么高了 "

从很多方面来看 希格拉德拉塞丽娜镇都像是西班牙危机的一个缩影 由于很多耗资巨大的工程超支 并欠下大量欠款 很多小镇都面临和西班牙国家和地区政府同样的问题 他们正在为建筑业的衰败而犯愁

但是由于当地的居民在政府支持不住的时候挺身而出 希格拉德拉塞丽娜镇在西班牙声名大增 加西亚说 经常有其他镇子的官员打来电话向自己讨教是怎么做到这些的 加西亚没有薪水可领 其他两个选举出来的官员也是一样 他们甚至放弃了工作中配备的公车和电话 加西亚说 "我们入不敷出 在公共事业上的投资并不理智 技术也十分欠缺 欧盟的借款本应用于正常政府运作 并维持到2013 可是即使这些钱都已经花光了"

希格拉德拉塞丽娜镇有大约九百户民宅 周围是耕地 一直以来 小镇靠养猪以及种植橄榄维 生 在建筑热潮风靡的日子里 小镇也受到了热潮的席卷 镇上建立了一个文化中心 投资了 一家小型疗养院 但是这些项目却面临搁置以及成本超支的困境

文化中心还没有洗手间 粉刷成白色的疗养院坐落于小镇的边缘 至今还没有开放 这两个项目加起来共拖欠了银行470 000 其他的债务主要是小镇入不敷出造成的 这些开支包括医疗供应 燃油 公路维护 电力供应以及那些在节假日表演的音乐家们

希格拉德拉塞丽娜镇并不是一名工人也没有 它有一名半工半薪的图书管理员 两名半工半薪 的道路清洁工 一名在体育中心兼职的工作人员 一名秘书和一名管理员 他们的薪水都来自 小镇外的其他渠道 但在此之前 镇子里的工人数量是现在的两倍 体育中心每天开放四个小 时 现在只要工作人员生病 志愿者们就必须接手体育中心的工作 否则体育中心必须关闭

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
